## Feeding The Flock

Have you ever seen one of those paintings that look like random dots of colour that project no image – but then as you gaze at it, suddenly something like the Eiffel Tower or the Toronto skyline come into view? Many of Jesus' teachings seem to work this way. We often need to read and reread some gospel passages just so that we can refocus our minds according to God's wisdom. That's why it is so important to ponder the Scriptures prayerfully and not try to read them just for the "raw data" they provide. We need to experience the Holy Spirit reorienting our perspective so that we can see through Christ's eyes.

How can the poor and the hungry be blessed or "perfectly happy"? Of course, extreme poverty and hunger cause a human misery that must be addressed in an immediate and material way. Yet here Jesus is teaching that those who seek satisfaction through material wealth are often masking an innate longing for God. Those who admit their utter poverty apart from knowing God and, forsaking other pursuits, hunger and thirst for his Spirit – these are the ones who will be rewarded with true and lasting happiness.

To those who are weeping and mourning, Jesus does not say "get over it." He is not advocating pragmatic resignation, for instance, to the death of a loved one. But he also assures us that those who weep with Him now will laugh with joy later, for they will be consoled beyond their hopes. Jesus knows that love demands a permanent union, and He promises that we can experience this in His kingdom.

"Blessed are you when people hate you and ... exclude and insult you" (Luke 6:22). We humans are intricately connected to each other. The slightest sour look or belittling tone from just the right person can crush us for days. How can being hated and excluded bring us perfect happiness? When we are persecuted because of Christ, it is because we are bumping up against old earthly mind-sets. This is when we should rejoice and pray for our persecutors: May they pause and wonder at our response – and perhaps turn to Christ as a result!

*"Thank you, Father, for giving me the mind of Christ. Help me today to keep my mind on the things above, where Christ is seated in glory."* ❖

We are part of a worldwide brotherhood of some 1.7 million brothers who feel and do much the same as us.


We are a council who has proven twice over in the last four years that it is a council of STARS. Yes, I mean we have been awarded the STAR COUNCIL award twice.

### **Why Is Easter So Early This Year?**

Easter is always the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox (March 20, 2008). The dating of Easter is based on the lunar calendar that Hebrew people used to identify Passover. This is why it moves around on our Roman calendar.

This year, Easter is celebrated the earliest that any of us will ever see the rest of our lives! Only the most elderly of our population have ever seen it this early (95 years old or above). None of us have ever, or will ever, see it a day earlier. Here’s why:

1) The next time Easter will be this early (March 23) will be the year 2228 (220 years from now). The last time it was this early was 1913 (so if you’re 95 or older, you are the only ones that were around for that).

2) The next time it will be a day earlier, March 22, will be in the year 2285 (277 years from now). The last time it was on March 22 was 1818. So, no one alive today has or will ever see it any earlier than this year!

# The Ontario Knights of Columbus Bursary Program 2008

The Ontario Jurisdiction of the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic, Fraternal, Family Organization, continues its provincial bursary program in honor of our State Chaplains, to assist Knights and members of their families pursuing a post-secondary education.

## **RULES AND CONDITIONS**      *\* Only Current Bursary Application Forms will be accepted.*

### **A) ELIGIBILITY**

#### 1) CANDIDATES ELIGIBLE FOR AN ONTARIO KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS BURSARY ARE:

- i. A member of the Knights of Columbus of Ontario in good standing.
- ii. The wife, son or daughter of a member in good standing.
- iii. The wife, son or daughter of a deceased member in good standing at the time of his death.
- iv. A grandchild who is the legal ward of a member in good standing.

#### 2) CANDIDATES MUST HAVE APPLIED FOR ADMISSION INTO A FULL-TIME PROGRAM AT A UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE IN ONTARIO.

3) Marks, although important, will not be the only criteria used by the evaluating committee. Proven financial need and service to church and community will be heavily weighted.

### **B) APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

The final date for filing an application shall be April 16. Materials submitted in support of the application are not returnable.

#### **NOTE - An application is deemed to be incomplete unless completed in full and includes the following items:**

- An autobiographical statement containing a description of the applicant's educational objectives and his/her involvement in the parish/council/community/school must accompany the application form. **One (1) typed page maximum.**
- A letter of recommendation from the Principal of the secondary school (or designate) shall be forwarded to the Bursary committee.
- An official transcript of secondary school grades including, if applicable, mid-term marks of the second semester of the final year must accompany the application form.

### **C) IMPORTANT**

- 1) The decision of the Bursary Committee shall be final. Successful candidates will be notified by mail, by June 16 and their names and Council affiliation will be published in the fall edition of the State Bulletin.
- 2) A cheque representing the amount of the bursary shall be forwarded to the college/university, upon receipt of verification of proof of registration and attendance.
- 3) The amount of the bursary and the number of bursaries granted may vary annually.
- 4) **Incomplete applications will not be considered by the Bursary Committee.**

Every issue of **COLUMBIA** has an article on Father McGivney and/or the headquarters of the Knights of Columbus in New Haven, Connecticut. Last April, while visiting my daughter, who lives about 45 minutes from New Haven, my wife and I decided to drive to the Museum and St. Mary's Church. It happened to be a Monday, when the Museum is closed, but a kind brother Knight let us come in anyway when he heard we had come from Canada! It sounded so far away!

The Museum is constantly changing exhibits and the two at that time were The Swiss Guard and Joan of Arc. The Swiss Guard was celebrating 500 years of Papal Service (1506-2006). There was a display of its history and the actual uniforms worn over the years (Figure 1). In another room, dedicated to the "French Maid", were paintings, sculpture, posters for movies about Joan of Arc, engravings and an extensive history of her life and death. There is also a gift shop where we bought a beautiful cross to add to our daughter's collection. She has them from all over the world, displayed on her kitchen wall. There are many other permanent artefacts throughout the museum, such as the chair where Pope John Paul sat during a visit to the US.

Outside, in the gardens is a statue of Christopher Columbus (Figure 2) and a bronze wall engraved with the names of Knights killed during the great wars. Under the Ontario section, we noted a name from Council 1049; that of Maurice Halpin! (Figure 3)

Within walking distance of the headquarters is St. Mary's Church, where, in its basement, 126 years ago, Father Michael McGivney (Figure 4) organized a group of men who would become the Knights of Columbus. I have a booklet, with beautiful photos if anyone is interested in reading more about St. Mary's. Although Father McGivney was originally buried in Waterbury his body was moved to St. Mary's Church in 1982, and re-entombed in a double bronze coffin within a granite sarcophagus at the rear of the church. We offered prayers here for all of you and your families. Each day at 7:30 a.m., a memorial Mass is celebrated for deceased Knights and deceased wives of members in all parts of the world.
